Passenger loading Fuel supplies Setting up- hoses, etc. Loading and unloading equipment Messenger service

Policing the grounds (Cleaning up) Emptying trash cans Informing the public Doing whatever else needs doing AND very important - putting away when it's over. This always falls to a few. If many would help it would be quick and easy.
