# Trainmasters Report By Ross Crawford

The switch committee is still working on its procedures under the direction of Al Shelley. The incoming station switch now seems ok except it has

a hump in it. The unofficial switch committee is Al Shelley, Karle Mahler and myself.

I am progressing slowly on the GP40 trucks because of more attention paid to the cars on the yellow train.

Don Juergenson has reworked the CP40 final drive gearboxes for installing new wheels.

Karle Mahler made several parts for the club's switch machines.

I have put the new riding car #2003 made by Don Juergenson in the yellow consist so we can evaluate it successfully. Milon Thorley loaned the other prototype riding car but has agreed to reclaim it for evaluation.

I have designed a new guard rail that is currently being tested.

Jack Friedman rewired the headlights on the SW1500. The sprockets on the SW1500 are coming loose so I will need someone to install a device to retain them.

I still need someone to do some cosmetic work on the GP40 fuel tanks but we need to try them on the engine first.

Jack Friedman will disassemble the remaining Johnson trucks to see which parts can be saved.

The Alco needs new screws in the front railing. These got broken out by the iron bridge at the end of the boxcar being allowed to fall back against the railings. I did a temporary fix for the problem but I could use a helper to install a safety chain on the iron bridge. Track Superintendent By Pete Arney

Despite very changeable weather this past month, track maintenance and upgrade continues.



Steaming water is now

available at Hillview. Two water faucets have been installed, one at each and of the center track, on a new water line extended from the Midway water tower. This will compliment steaming water sources already in place at Midway, Oasis, and the passenger station. Thanks to Lee Frechette, Lee's brother-inlaw Keith Gockel, and Will Jordan for their efforts.

Keith Berry is continuing to keep busy by replacing ties where needed. The past few weeks he has spent time on the Riverview track from the park gate to just east of the new steel rail installed earlier this year, the main line north of Twin Bridges, and the track in the park between the upper/lower yard switch and the passenger station track 1-2 switch.

All new and replacement rail installations are using rail joiner bars instead of the Spall-type joiners. The bars are being fabricated by Dick Esselbach and Jack Friedman.

Karle Mahler is doing a great job of machining and installing switch rail points out of steel rail. The immediate goal is to manufacture twelve sets of points for replacement of existing poor quality points. He is using a design developed by Al Shelley and Ross Crawford. Karle continues to refine the design to improve the operation and has completed or is in the process of upgrading several switches.

Milon Thorley has volunteered to replace the remote switch throw at the north end of Box Car yard. The current wood post is rotted. Milon will install a new steel post and cast metal operating mechanism. Milon will also arrange for the delivery of more *Continued on page 6*

serpentine road base for use as ballast.

As soon as weather permits, a solution of linseed oil and mineral spirits will be applied to bridges and trestles.

Volunteers will be welcomed for this task.

Several areas of track have been realigned, leveled, and re ballasted: northbound main line at Hillview; northbound near Oasis from the through girder bridge over Cobble Creek south to Midway; eastbound out of Oasis prior to South Cobble Creek grade crossing; southbound in park between upper/lower yard and passenger station switches. Thanks to Keith Berry, Richard Lutrel and his nephew Jacob (plus the understanding patience of his new bride, Amy), and Michael Presson.

Earlier this year, Michael Frazier Designs became a source of donated redwood tie material. We were able to obtain enough wood to make several hundred ties. Recently, however, Mr. Frazier has begun using the wood he had been giving us in his products and will not be able to donate any more material. We continue to use our supply of ties at a fast clip, so we will need to locate a new source of material.

Shortly, the Track Superintendent's projects will be posted on the SVLS web site (click on "Projects" under "Club Information"). The information will be kept current by the web master. Special thanks to Dale King for enthusiastically offering to host and update the project page and for Dale's patience waiting for the Track Superintendent to put the project list together. Page categories will include: "In Progress projects", "Unassigned Projects", and "Long Range Projects". Everyone is welcome to choose as many tasks as they wish to do or be involved with. Let the Track Superintendent know so the task can be assigned.

The following tasks need immediate attention and are some of those that will appear on the web site:

#### Switches

- . Lubricate switch point slide plates and throws.
- . N Curve to park: fix main/bypass switch throw.
- . Clean rocks and debris from switch throws, frogs, guard

rails, and points.

. NW corner box car, track to transfer table: switch points don't close, loose bar.

. N loop switch @ mp10: add ties, slide plates, ballast.

. Upper/lower yard switch: remove and lower hump in road base under switch.

. Lower yard west, switch for tracks 1-2: replace defective switch points.

#### Right of Way

. Hillview N switch to Memorial Grove to North Curve: realign and ballast rail

. Meadows main & siding: fill gopher holes & ballast; remove dirt washed into track.

. All culverts: clean out, move soil away from ends; stack rocks.

. Passenger station lead tracks from park: replace ties, add ballast.

. North Curve grade crossing: remove rail dips caused by vehicle traffic.

. North Curve to park: extend (2) 4" drain pipes either side of grade; add fill to either side of grade to widen roadbed.

. Hillview northbound, north of Twin Bridges: add fill to either side of grade to widen roadbed.

. Riverview east cut: clean out drainage ditches either side of road bed.

#### <u>Rail</u>

. North Curve: align track to elevate outside rail; currently 3/16" lower than inside rail on curve.

. North past Yard Trestle, 1st curve to east: replace outside alum rail w/ steel rail from Reverso switch to 90' west.

. Ponds crossing: straighten square rail joint east end of through girder bridge.

. Check rail joints for correct Spall rail joiner placement.

#### Bridges/Trestles

. East Hill southbound: rebuild temp bridge over irrigation trench to be permanent.

. Apply 50/50 mixture boiled linseed oil/mineral spirits.

. Tin Man truss bridge: replace (3) 4'-6" ties at south end;

(1) 1" x 2-1/2" walk strip at north end.

. Trestles: clean soil away from wood support pilings.

Work days are held on all Tuesdays and some Saturdays in addition to the scheduled monthly work Saturday. Contact the Track Superintendent if you would like to contribute your time and expertise to a worthwhile and important effort for the club.




# Club web update
