SP Caboose Move - by Ross Crawford

On 1 December we moved the SP caboose to the SVLSRM facility from the old El Dorado and Southern railroad located at Milon Thorleys home.



Before this could be done I had to find a mover who was capable of the job and after some research and getting the approval of the Board we decided on Taylor Heavy Hauling who had experience moving railroad equipment.

I got help from Ben Kleinwachter and Andy Berchielli to prepare for the move, this involved cutting the overhanging tree so that the crane could position over the caboose. They Removed the radio platform, smokestack, and walkways from the roof to reduce height. Also removed brake rigging so body could be lifted off the trucks. We oiled the journal boxes so the caboose could be rolled from under the tree onto steel plates so the crane could swing it from the ground onto the hauling trailer. The crew pulled the fence back from the driveway so the flatbed trailer could have clearance. Pete Arney brought a load of railroad ties to fill in the ditch for the trailer to swing a wide radius and later returned them to the SVLSRM.

I arranged for the pad the caboose sits on now. More pictures on Page 4.

Also, special thanks to the "fallen leaf society", who struggled long and hard to capture the fallen leaves covering the track and steaming bays before the New Year Run Day. Many trips were made to the parks mulch pile using Dick Esselbach's pick-up. This crew also addressed several plumbing problems, caused by the sub-freezing temperatures. At this time permanent repairs are planned for the line valves delivering air/water to the steaming bays and the sector valve controlling the transfer bay watering line.

A top priority is re-tieing the south meadow crossing and switch. This section is rotted, misaligned, and is missing a switch throw. Phasing our work, we can resolve these problems.

Safety Rules Review

114. All SVLSRM owned material and equipment is for use of members and guests at the SVLSRM facility ONLY, and shall not be removed from

the facility without specific permission from the Board of Directors. This includes treated or distilled water, fuel, cars, locomotive, tools, material, etc.

228. No locomotive shall be operated at an excessive speed, and shall not be operated at a speed greater that any speed from which the locomotive and its train can be slowed and stopped within a reasonable distance, depending on the traffic, track conditions, visibility and weight of the train. Absolute maximum speed of any train shall be 7 mph actual (10 seconds between milepost markers).

302 All members share equal privileges and use of the facilities. All members also have equal responsibility for the safety and maintenance of the facility, equipment, and the observance and enforcement of these rules. Every member is responsible to, and for, every other member. There are no so-called "privileged" members.

412. Steam locomotives shall be operated so as to prevent anyone from being burned or having their clothing soiled by steam from cylinder cocks, exhaust, blow-down valves, whistles, or other emissions.
