

Last month things seemed gloomy trying to find insurance for us; well after 20 plus leads and over 300 E-mails, we now have our club insurance. There will be some changes in our operation both for safety reasons and risk reduction. We have insurance to run no more than three passenger trains: these can be pulled by club engine or we can substitute a member's engine. I thank the members that were helpful in researching insurance or providing leads to such.

What is changing is members member's engines are not covered by this insurance nor the hauling of passengers. Therefore we are requiring members and guest (like at our meets) to sign a release of liability for them and their guests. This will be done at registration at the meet. We have also changed our passenger train max speed to 5 mph. This is about 15 seconds between mileposts. This not only provides safer riding but a smoother ride and everyone can better enjoy the scenery. The older riding cars are being changed out to drop-center riding cars.

The down side of the new insurance is that it is costing us twice as much so we are in need of finding more sources of funding to keep the club operating. There are many feet of track that still need replacing and rail, ties, hardware, & gravel cost is (was) our main expense. So with your thinking (engineer) cap on, engineer us a safe way to acquire funds to support SVLSRM.

Each year in May we honor those members that have passed during this last year by adding their names to the club memorial. The names this year being added are: Don Juergenson, Robert "Red" Hadler, Bruce Eaton. Earl L. "Bud" Rogers, III, Michael Collins.

The knowledge loss each year from our members passing shows that we need to bring more younger members into the club and continue teaching about our rich heritage of steam engines and railroad that help build this country. We are a family organization dedicated to preserving the lore and history of American steam railroading with a scale fully functioning steam engine and a railroad for children and adults alike to ride on and enjoy. Avoiding Bearing Failures - by Ross Crawford

We all would like to have a way to easily identify a bearing that is going to fail without inverting every car once a month. Here's a solution: take a piece of steel 1 1/4 x 1/8 x 14". Push it across the rails, under the truck side frames, in front of the wheelset you want to check.

Rotate the steel bar with a crescent wrench until the wheelset is free to turn (make sure axel is level). Spin the wheelset and if it is noisy or does not make 4 revolutions, change out the truck or the axle and bearing.

You can check a whole string of cars in 15 minutes and done on a regular basis will eliminate all bearing failures on the road.



Prevent this from happening to your wheels.

Warn axel due to bad bearing.

SAFETY RULES FOR THE MONTH

Visiting engineers, trainman, and their guests are to observe these rules and abide by them. Copies of these rules shall be made available to visiting engineers while they are operating on SVLSRM tracks. Visitors may purchase copies of these rules to keep.

- All engines must be run at reduced speeds in congested areas and in areas with close clearance, such as yards, stations, etc.
- 303. All conductors and engineers must be able to demonstrate thorough knowledge of basic rules of safe operation to the satisfaction of the Trainmaster or his designated alternate and in addition all engineers shall be thoroughly briefed on the individual engines they are to operate.
- 408. Steam boilers shall have the water level gauge located with the bottom of the gauge high enough above the crown sheet level to show ample water covering the crown. The water glass shall be located so it is readily seen from the engineers operating position.
