Long Range Planning – Hydraulic Lift replacement. No cost estimates are ready for discussion and two new designs were discussed. Dennis Spadaroa has volunteered to replace the seals in the lifts. A Motion was made and carried to allocate \$250 to replace the seals.

FCR 2019-27 Update – On site locomotive car storage. A plan and building permit process should be in place by February for grant purposes as funding is needed. Winter Projects – Board looked at small projects that could be accomplished over winter with little funds needed.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of you for supporting me in assuming the position of superintendent. I will endeavor to continue the fine work by Doug Fulton over the past two years many projects have been completed through Doug's efforts and expertise. Also, special thanks to the "fallen leaf society", who struggled long and hard to capture the fallen leaves covering the track and steaming bays before the New Year Run Day. Many trips were made to the parks mulch pile using Dick Esselbach's pick-up. This crew also addressed several plumbing problems, caused by the sub-freezing temperatures. At this time permanent repairs are planned for the line valves delivering air/water to the steaming bays and the sector valve controlling the transfer bay watering line. A top priority is re-tieing the south meadow crossing and switch. This section is rotted, misaligned, and is missing a switch throw. Phasing our work, we can resolve these problems. Lastly, the caboose needs some attention to relocate cabinets, install sinks, and upgrade electrical service. -- Keith Berry, Superintendent.

With a new year upon us, I'm looking forward to some great days at the park. Weather permitting; we'll see you at the park on Tuesdays, Public Run Days, and Club Member run days and this winter on Saturday work days. Steam locomotives always look great on cold days! Remember, to warm your butane fuel in your home and keep it relatively warm while out at the park. January will be a good month to tinker with the locomotives inside where it is warm. Lubricate all the moving parts and car wheels as well. Tighten loose bolts and screws. Adjust couplers if needed. An old friend, Jim Daly suggested Marvel Mystery Oil and StaLube Multi-Purpose – Super White Grease as good products for this small train hobby. Dave Hottmann suggested Luca Oil for use as steam oil. And good old 3-In-One works wonders.

Just a reminder, during the months of January and February the club closes down the public run days, however, each Saturday is a work day. All hand help with cleaning up and doing some adjustments to the railroad. I do know the 7.5" gauge rail will be worked on, and this requires some rework of the outbound rails for the steaming bay and adding length to the snow shed.
