


#### Librarian - Alison Berry

I am finally starting to sort magazines. I know many of you are eager to know what Live Steam issues we have and what we plan to do with the extras. Several have even told me specific issues that they are looking for and hope we have. As I am trying to

unpack all the boxes first, I am not working on Live Steam magazines right now.

It has been a bit of a treasure hunt as I open the remaining

boxes. I found a box of Outdoor Railroader magazines – published between 1992 and 1996. While the target audience is G-Scale, the detailed plans could probably be used for any scale. In 1997, Outdoor Railroader was now published as Finescale Railroader – the first year both titles were on the magazine. We have issues from 1997 to 2005, We also have several of the annual publications (2003, 2004, 2005, 2006) including



two special editions on Logging, Mining, and Industrial as well as one special edition on Narrow Gauge. The publisher of these magazines still has a website where one can purchase digital copes of the magazines.

So far, I have found 7 issues of Tall Timber Short Lines – 2002 – 2004. Tall Timber Short Lines was a magazine dedicated to logging railroads and short line railroads, and was published by Oso Publications. The magazine was founded in 1993 with the title Timber Beast. It was read both by model railroaders and those into logging history and modeling. It was headquartered first in Tacoma, Washington, and then in Hamilton, Montana. The magazine ended publication in August 2008.

My next task will be logging Garden Railroad issues. I know we have over a box but I have 3 more boxes I haven't opened and am not sure what they hold. I have also found copies of Steam in the Garden magazines.

We have a full box of Narrow Gauge and Short Line Gazette. This magazine is still in publication but the issues we have are probably 20 years old.

We have a lot of actual time tables, engineer handbooks and, conductor handbooks. Please let me know if you think we should keep this type of publications.

Magazines cannot be checked out but can be viewed in the library. You can also use your cell phone to take photographs of pages that interest you. Magazines are too fragile to be checked out.

The 2012 track replacement project was completed last month. We replaced 440 feet of track and one switch on the south side of Hill View. The new Midway North yard is the next project we need to finish in time for the Spring Meet. We still have to finish spreading ballast, Leveling, and tamping. This new yard will be a excellent location for members and guests with electric locomotives to park and charge their equipment. Thanks again to all the members that came out to help.

**20 Years ago:** JWe are back from Maricopa. M.L.S. had their Spring Meet on the same weekend as our last general meeting and

it was well worth the trip. This is one track you should try and get to if you like running on a signal / dispatch system. Two of the

three runs they have at this time are single line, bidirectional, poin- to-point runs with automatic signals and passing lanes. Made for a very interesting time. The third line they have is a long (2 miles) run out into the desert and back. Great place to just let it roll and take in some sightseeing.

On a closer note, we have our Spring Meet coming up and still have some work to get done in preparation for that. I still would like to get the switch at Cordova Junction (off the main into the passenger station) re-tied and would like to get the rest of the cement ties in the ground continuing from where we left off - towards the girder bridge.

**30 Years ago:** A special thanks go to Henry and Rose Stefani for donating and mounting a mirror in one of the new restrooms. Much progress has been made since my last report in February. We purchased rough cedar 2" x 12" x 8' fro bridge ties and Richard & Bobby Bristow ripped them into 2

x 2's in very short order. We bought enough to do two 40 foot bridges and they had them all cut in just a couple of hours. Milon and I went to Yuba City and picked up a load (1700 board feet) of rough redwood 2" x 10" remnants to be cut into 2" x 2" x 15" pieces for track ties and I am happy to report that several members have already cut most of this load into ties which have been bundled and stacked in the boxcar. The new bridge in the expansion area is nearing completion. Milon Thorley and Ed Spall deserve a great deal of credit for an excellent job on the steel work on the bridge. The bridge should be complete enough to run on

by the end of the 2nd week of April.. The overhead truss work will be added later. Dick Esselback, Ken Willes and I spent most of the past weekend wire brushing and removing rust from the steel in preparation for painting. Al Shelly has recently completed two more switches which will be used to complete the first 800' loop in the expansion area. If you have panel track kits at home, we need them to be completed and returned as soon as possible as they will be used to complete the first loop in time for the Spring Meet. Both of our sidings are now operational bidirectionally for both 7 1/2 as well as 4 3/4 inch gauge equipment.

**40 Years ago:** The construction of the four club riding cars is moving along right

on schedule. The bodies are complete and in the process of being painted and lettered and the trucks and couplers are now under construction. On March 20, massive doses of hard work were passed out and the following was adequately accomplished: Tables were stripped, earth was moved, the inner facility and the entire outer hill were mowed, weeds were whacked, the track was sprayed with weed killer, a rope barrier was constructed, and the switches were seeded. Many thanks for all the hard work and team effort displayed by: Keith Kirstein, Stan Hindsley, Joe and Al DeFreitas, Darrel McWhirk, Ken and Nadine Willes, Dick Esselbach, Don and Jeri Juergenson, Roger and Mathew Merkh, Warren Rose, Earl McKenzie, Amandus Drews, Jacob and Michael Rosen and the Gramith's. The new switch on the inbound side went into place on March 27, the second, very productive, work day for the month.



#### **Secretary Board Report**

The Board meets by ZOOM. Members are always encouraged to attend. The next meeting is November 8, 6:30 p.m. If you would like to attend, contact Andy Berchielli, (916) 752-6697, for how to connect to ZOOM or Stephanie Huntingdale (916) 580-7377 for an Agenda.

Fareharbor, a reservation system has been used for our Santa Run; we now are using it with much success for our Birthday party reservations. We are looking into having a reservation system for Public Runs.

Measure H application – application submitted on March 13th. Included in our application was a cover letter that pointed out our community involvement. We served over 10,000 riders in 2021. In addition, our members provided 4,592 volunteer hours to maintain the park, track, storage facilities, and restrooms for the public enjoyment of public runs and birthday parties. Currently there are 94 applicants for these funds.

The park has worked on the well and turned on the water again. We are in the process of cleaning out valves and sprinkler heads in our irrigation system.

Track work continues with the center siding in place. A new FCR for the Hillview/Tank Yard siding.

Special Membership Meeting at the park on Saturday, April 16th, 1:30 pm for final Bylaw review.

## SAFETY RULES FOR THE MONTH

#### 1.15 Children

Parents or Guardians shall be responsible for the safety, supervision,

and behavior of their Children at all times.

#### 2.06 Wheel Dimensions and Coupler

**Heights** All wheel dimensions and coupler height standards shall conform to IBLS standards. A copy of these standards can be found on the SVLSRM webpage.

#### 3.17 Access to Round House

Access to the round house shall be available to all members by the the board of directors during members run days and events.

#### 4.04 Responsibilities of Stationmaster

The Stationmaster will have complete charge of the Station. The Stationmaster shall have a whistle (police type), red flag, and flashlight in their possession at all times while acting as a Stationmaster. They shall supervise the loading and unloading of all passengers at the passenger station. They shall discreetly refuse passage to passengers who obviously cannot fit or sit safely on a passenger hauling car. They shall make certain that all passengers have been advised and understand the safety instructions before the train leaves the station. They shall work in close cooperation with other operating personnel to keep passenger-hauling trains moving without causing congestion on the mainline.
