The end of January we decided it was best to replace trestle #1 heading into the expansion area. After years of minor repairs the trestle

was showing its age. Help from Alex Owen's contact with several suppliers, we were able to get most of the material donated. Thanks Alex for the connections. The deck will be completely new wood with 4" C channel as the main stringers. The retaining walls on both ends of the bridge have been replaced with a concrete wall. With the concrete work, it put the project a week behind. So March Public run day will be either the original loop in the park or the inner loop used for parties.

Come the first of March registration will be available for our 50th Spring Meet. The main reason for the early start is to make sure we have enough food and enough supplies of the 50th anniversary shirt and coin. RV, steaming bay and track assignment can be made there too. In between rain showers we have got all four of the club steamer boilers hydro'd. All passed but we found a few minor leaks in some of the plumbing.

We also got the Dash 9 running again. We had an issue with no spark!! After some research online (YouTube), we had failed diodes in the kill switch wiring. Picked up a new wiring set with new diodes, pulled the front cover off the motor and everything around it and replaced the wiring. All good now.

Many thanks to Kevin Sach, and those that assisted him. He took on the task of applying all the new lettering to the public run ride on cars. The lettering looks great.

Now if we have an issue with a ride on car, the car number can be recorded and I will know what car to fix.

We will get 1973 lubricator reinstalled and tested before public runs start in March. Those running 1973 will notice that you can see the water level in the sight glass again.

So if you have some spare time on a weekend and want to help your club, come on down and volunteer some time. There is always something that needs to be done, raked, or cleaned.

New or enhanced concrete abutments, rebuilt bents, new steel and wood stringers, and new ties. It is hoped to have this project completed by early March. Thanks in particular to Andy B., Tom R. and Glenn W. for their time and assistance.

Elsewhere, the goal is to have most, if not all of the mainline leveled and ballasted as needed by the Spring Meet. In addition, we hope to give most of the sidings and spurs some TLC.

Another area that needs attention are the elevated tracks leading onto and off the turntable. We would very much like to replace all those ties before the meet.

All in all, these are very ambitious goals!

In the spring of 1972, after much scrounging and scraping for money, materials and space, construction was started in the Cordova Community Park. The blistered hands and aching backs were soon forgotten on May 20th, 1973 when all hands cheered as a solid gold spike sank into a polished walnut tie and a big 2-8-2 touched pilots with a diamond stacked American.

The trestle project had to be abandoned as further inspection revealed that all the verticals were weather damaged and had to be removed. We made a decision to place culvert pipes and add fill to put the track back in service. If some one is willing to take on the building of all the parts to replace the trestle and have them ready to install, we can remove the fill and replace it next year.

The track crew has hand dug most of the trench for the roadbed and Bill Yoder did the finish work with his small tractor. We also got our donated Oliver Tractor up and running and started filling the trench with ballast. The crew will be laying tack panels this month and we are working to open the track by April. I want to Thank all our volunteers for there hard work and I will recognize all when the project is completed. - Darrell Gomes
