John Bailie was a member of SVLS since the early 80's and active nearly all of those years. He also was a member at times of GGLS and Northern Nevada Live Steamers.

John is most known for his absolutely beautiful works of model engineering art. John made nearly every part of his locomotives including all the valves, water glasses, safeties, boilers, etc. Even the tube roller to seal his boiler tubes was self-built. He also tried his hand at injectors for his locomotives. John extended his mastery into making full-functioning grandfather clocks from scratch in the last few years.

John designed nearly everything of what he machined and fabricated. The above-mentioned parts were all his own design and many of them were published in model engineering magazines including Live Steam, The Home Railway Journal, and club newsletters.

The most enduring quality of John was that he would help anyone who wanted to learn. If you were willing to put the work in, John was the ultimate instructor. He was not only willing to help you solve your problem, but he would also research the issue in his vast library to find the answer.

He took many kids under his wing, teaching them on his machines the skills necessary to build their own locomotives and models. Beyond the spirit of "each one, teach one," he went on to teaching so many. Many students of his went on to complete their first locomotives, and even inspiring some to work on full-size equipment becoming experts in the field of steam locomotive restoration and operation which has turned quite a few hunks of rusting metal into working machines we can ride behind today.

Around the club John made many of the things we use today including the new-type riding cars, club ballast cars, and put in many of the transfer table steaming bays by himself using wood structures to hold up the bays while he mixed and poured the cement.

Countless other projects were done by him as well.

John was the founder of the Sacramento Locomotive Works, a builders' group in the area to encourage show and tell sessions of model engineering of all types. He was also encouraging others to build and explore.

John will be missed by all who knew him. He was a true friend and passed on much of his knowledge to others, for which many of us benefited and all have been grateful. ~ Matt Mason

## 2.02 Daylight Operations

All Locomotives shall be

equipped with a whistle, horn, or other sounding device producing audible signals. Such sounding devices shall be powerful enough to be heard distinctly for at least 150 feet. All locomotives shall carry a red flag and whistle to warn traffic of emergencies and for passing on visual and audible signals.

### 3.02 Responsibilities of the Conductor

Each conductor shall have a whistle (police type) and a red flag or light in their possession at all times while acting as conductor. They shall assist in loading or unloading passengers on the train. They shall be certain that all passengers on their train have been informed of the safety rules before signaling to the engineer to proceed from the station. They shall enforce all passenger safety rules while the train is in motion. They shall enforce rules and shall prevent any passengers from throwing any trash, garbage or other refuse from the train along the right-of- way. They shall align all switches (turnouts) for the mainline after use of such switches by their train. They shall assist the engineer when necessary and shall call for help when necessary to enforce any rules.
