Hello everyone, and I hope you have all had a great start to 2024! With the first month of our winter projects in the books, there is some great work taking place around the

great work taking place around the railroad. At the start of the new year, our new compressor was delivered and has been installed in the roundhouse. While this unit is currently connected to the existing air lines, future projects will include replacing these air lines that run from the roundhouse to the steam bays, as well as installing new universal fittings at the steam bays. Our volunteers have also been busy removing the aluminum rail and worn-out double track at Oasis, and this will soon be replaced with steel rail on plastic ties. With the track removed and roadbed cleared, we are also using this time to run conduit for future signals into Oasis. Additional signal work will soon be started at the south end of Hillview West as well as Midway South, and this signal work is anticipated to be completed before the 2024 Spring Meet.

While these projects are taking place, ongoing tasks that always need attention around the railroad continue to be well managed by our volunteers, and I would like to thank everyone who has spent time helping to keep the railroad looking its best.

Diesel (gas and electric) and steam locomotive party & event rentals have gone on sale for 2024. Our party & event rentals run between March and September, and serve as an excellent opportunity for public outreach, these events bring in additional funding to the club, and provide an opportunity for members to get familiar with our railroad and operating practices. Greetings from the Track Department,

Well, we asked for folks to pitch in and help with the track renewal

project at Oasis Station. The response has been nothing short of fantastic!

Over the first 3 weekends of January, more than 20 different members of our SVLS family have come out to lend a hand! Many of those folks have been out all three weekends. We've experienced every kind of weather – bright and sunny, rainy, cold, windy, and foggy. Through all of that we've made great progress! The old track was removed and disassembled. The trenches for future signal installations were dug and the conduit was placed and buried. The old ballast was removed and hauled away. New turnout kits were built. Except for the tractor work, everything else was good old fashioned hard work!

By the time you read this, we'll be laying the new base, ballast, and starting to lay track panels and turnouts. We've accomplished a lot, but we have a long way to go. The turnouts will need to be carefully aligned. The new track panels will need to be connected, leveled, and tamped. The existing yard tracks will need to be connected to the new track.

A tall order, to be sure. Yet, due to the dedication and enthusiasm of our members, it'll get done! If you've not been out yet, feel free to jump in. We'd appreciate the help, and you'll have chance to work with some really nice, really dedicated people.



SAFETY RULES FOR THE MONTH

1.14 Pets

No pets of any kind shall be allowed to run free within the facility. All pets shall be confined on a leash not over 6 feet in length, or inside a crate or

pen. The owner of such pets shall be responsible for immediately cleaning up any manure or other disagreeable mess caused by such pet. Any violation of this rule may result in both pet and owner being asked to leave the facility. Animals may not ride on public passenger trains. Owners may be asked not to have their animals ride at the discretion of the station master. Animals must be kept away from any areas of food preparation or consumption.

2.12 Boiler Inspection

All steam boilers operated at the SVLSRM facility shall carry a current boiler inspection tag, or card. This tag or card shall state the hydrostatic test pressure, the maximum operating pressure and the safety valve settings. The SVLSRM will accept valid current boiler inspection tag or card issued by recognized Live Steam Clubs for operation of steam locomotives and equipment on the SVLSRM facilities.

3.01 Responsibilities of the Engineer The Engineer is responsible for the safe handling of the train and the cars at all times. They must be in close cooperation with all other operating personnel, observing all rules and signals (whistles, hand, flag or light) given by the conductor and stationmaster. They must run their engine in conformance with SVLSRM safety rules at all times. They must see that any SVLSRM equipment used by them is returned to its proper storage space at the end of their run, unless another engineer takes over the responsibility of such equipment and agrees to see that such equipment is properly stored after its use.
